Those are collaborations that wouldn't have happened had the infrastructure not been there.</li> <li>[Williams]: A good metric to go off of is, if CPCRN weren't funded and you and your colleagues would still have done this work, then it would fall under CPCRN-related, and not reportable.</li> <li>[Williams]: To changes to the progress reporting system to note: 1) we've combined Catalyzing Action and Effecting Change; and 2) for publications, we need you to input the PMIDs for those that have one (i.e., listed on PubMed).</li> </ul>	-Lee will send Qualtrics survey to members this week to request input on format and structure for Yr 2 Virtual Annual Meeting  -Members are encouraged to continue engaging with the Meet the Centers Twitter/ Facebook campaign

Local Project Presentation	<ul> <li>HPV Vaccination in Rural Georgia</li> <li>Presented by Escoffery, Emory PI</li> <li>Question/Comments:         <ul> <li>[Thomson]: With your systematic review, are you including interventions targeting males, as well as those that are domestic and international?</li> <li>[Escoffery]: Yes to both. We are looking at both genders and also global interventions as well.</li> <li>[Heiney]: The way you laid out your lit review would be so helpful for our doctoral students who are struggling with this. Could you share your slides or is this already published?</li></ul></li></ul>	-Escoffery will share the slide set for training doctoral students to conduct systematic reviews

ISCC Meeting Debrief and Next Steps (Chambers)	-CPCRN was very well-represented throughout the Consortium  -Trying to amass all of the brainstorming that was done; will make that available to everyone  -Next phase will be to identify the people who volunteered to move different action items forward, and decide how to push those conversations along to gauge what kinds of support are needed, if any.  -Feedback/Impressions:  • [Wheeler]: We saw some natural synergy with CPCRN, given the conversations we've been having over the past couple of months about the need to advance our equity work. I was really happy to see equity, diversity, and inclusion came up in almost all of the action groups.  • [Rohweder]: In thinking about the CPCRN virtual meeting, I think it would be good to follow a similar format because I didn't feel burnt out at the end of the day, and it was organized really well. Additionally, what, if anything, in terms of products for the field will be incorporated into call for proposals, etc.? Will there be any kind of potential funding mechanisms attached to some of this work?  • [Chambers]: We are internally discussing what the avenues are, through which we might be able to support those. It's something that we've already started meeting about, so that will be part of this next phase.	-Chambers/other ISCC reps will make available the synthesized information gathered during brainstorming sessions  -Members who are interested in engaging with the Health Equity & SDOH Interest Group moving forward should contact the Coordinating Center to be added to the contact list
