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## Background and Rationale

- Ensuring proper screening is a challenge in cancer prevention and control
- Most interventions focus on a single type of cancer
- Opportunity exists to increase efficiency by "clustering" or "bundling" multiple cancer screening efforts together. Some examples include:
  - Presenting them as a single package during one office appointment
  - Attaching them to an already well-established appointment
- Similar existing programs: FluFIT and WiseWoman



### Proposed Activities

- 1. Identifying strategies for packaging screenings and implementation strategies for multiple screenings together
- ✓ These could be strategies being used up to now, for cancer screening/prevention or other preventive services.
- ✓ Or they could be novel ideas we come up with
- 2. Designing a study to test the feasibility and effectiveness of this type of intervention

- Literature review, systematic review
- Surveys of FQHCs & publication of findings
- Interviews with FQHC leaders & publication
- Become involved with ACS HPV roundtable
- Work with a consultant
- Manuscript about community-clinical linkage case studies
- Statistical modeling of potential effects
- Develop training & technical assistance materials/programs
- Pilot/feasibility test of novel strategies
